#### **USDA Disaster Resource Center**

The center contains information about specific disasters and emergencies, how to prepare, recover, and help build long-term resilience, as well as information about USDA assistance during disaster events.

### **USDA Rural Development Disaster Assistance**

When floods destroy or severely damage residential property, USDA Rural Development can assist with providing priority hardship application processing for single family housing.

#### **USDA Food and Nutrition Service**

The USDA Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) coordinates with state, local and voluntary organizations to provide food for shelters and other mass feeding sites.

#### **USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service - Emergency Watershed Protection Program**

For declared natural disasters that lead to imminent threats to life and property, the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) can assist local government sponsors with the cost of implementing recovery efforts like debris removal and streambank stabilization to address natural resource concerns and hazards through the Emergency Watershed Protection Program.

#### **USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service - Environmental Quality Incentives Program**

The NRCS Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) provides financial assistance to repair and prevent excessive soil erosion that can result from high rainfall events and flooding. Conservation practices supported through EQIP protect the land and aid in recovery, can build the natural resource base, and might help mitigate loss in future events.
